## Check in with Families



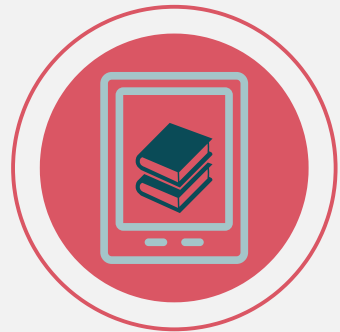
Explain what reading skills are taught, how, and by whom.



Tell when literacy instruction and intervention happen, for how long, and how many others participate.



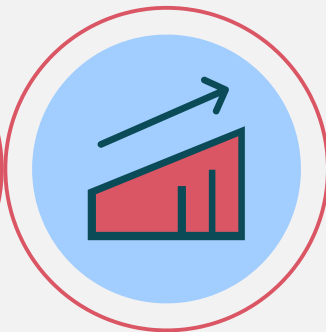
Describe how literacy instruction and intervention align with children's specific literacy needs.



Share what materials or trainings about literacy are available to families.



Tell what literacy screening practices you use and when.



Explain what information you collect on children's literacy progress.



Describe how the information is used to make decisions about children's literacy needs.



Share how you monitor children's language and literacy progress.



Explain how children with reading difficulties are identified.

Responses should build common understanding and promote joint action between home and school.



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
